

## **St. Paul Cemetery Rules and Regulations**

- Cemetery closed sunset to sunrise.
- Flowers placed by families at cemetery are allowed only if they are in permanent vases mounted above ground on the side of the monument base, in permanent vases on ground immediately adjacent to the sides of the monument base, or in saddle blankets on top of the monument anytime during the year. After the conclusion and before the beginning of the mowing season, between November through March 15<sup>th</sup>, grave blankets on the ground are permitted. Grave blankets not be picked up after March 15<sup>th</sup> will be removed.
- Live flowers, plastic flowers, plastic decorations, the establishment of mulched areas surrounding monuments with rocks or other materials, or any other kind of decorations on the ground surrounding the monuments or on the grave itself are not allowed.
- Shepard hooks for hanging baskets next to monument are not allowed. Existing shepherd hooks will be removed.
- Benches are not allowed unless incorporated into the monument.
- Foot markers or Veteran's markers must be set flush with the ground.
- All monuments will be made of granite. Marble and sandstone monuments are not allowed.
- Capstones below the monument bases or concrete flares beneath monument bases are not allowed on sloping grave sites. In some cases, on the limited number of grave sites that are on level ground, capstones may be allowed subject to prior approval of the Sextant. In no case will a capstone be wider than 22 inches.
- Monument companies must schedule a joint meeting time at the cemetery with the Sextant prior to setting the monument.
