Please sort and organize items prior to donating them, for easier placement in the designated areas; bag together puzzle pieces, game pieces and toys, help hang clothes or place items in areas when you drop off donations or ask if there is a task that needs to be done.

WE CANNOT ACCEPT

Electronics: televisions/computers/keyboards/printers/etc.

To recycle these items, the Recycling Center on West Jackson (next to WIRC) in Macomb, will take your electronics. Their hours to accept items are Tuesday – Friday, 9am to 12:30pm. Electrical items such as radios, record players, lamps, kitchen appliances should be in working condition to be accepted.

Additional Items (due to limited space and lack of sales in recent years):

Flower vases-some floral shops will accept these
Stuffed animals due to health concerns
Coffee mugs, plastic drinking cups, water bottles
Baby cribs, baby beds or car seats due to safety regulations
Intimate items such as adult underwear
Any items that are dirty or show excessive wear
Textbooks, magazines and outdated print items
Small toys or puzzles that are not bagged or assembled
Opened or partially used health care items.
